Past issues have included articles featuring or submitted by Maine activist groups such as P.O.W.E.R (Portland Organizing to Win Economic Rights), Nulankeyutomonen Nkihtakomikumon ("We take Care of Our Land," a Passamaquoddy group), MNPP (Maine Native Prison Project), and Centro Latino, to name a few.

Other articles, such as ones on the crisis in Darfur, present an alternative perspective to what is seen in mainstream news.

Many of our issues had covered articles translated in Spanish. I wrote articles had interviews with amazing people and laid many of the pages of this newspaper out.
